This requirement may also be reflected through significant leadership accomplishments in areas outside the high school setting. Examples of such leadership may include: Senior or Junior class president or Student Council president, Editor-in-Chief of school newspaper, founders of organizations, senior leadership in scouting or service organizations, Boys State or Girls State representative.</p> <p>2. Submission of the Hunt Essay (see below), and a completed first-year application for admission to SMU.</p> <p>3. Rank in top 25% of graduating class.*</p> <p>4. Composite SAT 1230 on Math and Critical Reading or ACT 28.</p> <p>5.
