What is a Mentor?

Mentors are role models who want to impart to students the characteristics of responsibility, caring, citizenship, respect, leadership and above all a positive attitude. A mentor does this by being a caring friend who listens, understands, and offers support and advice. A mentor is someone like you. You can assist students in various ways such as:

- Provide a model for correct behavior to emulate
 - Developing a positive belief in the benefits of education
 - Developing problem-solving skills
 - Provide consistency in chaotic situations
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What do Mentors Do?

Mentors provide on-going support in the areas of educational and personal growth. Mentoring is done during school hours and on school grounds. Mentors and students meet during their lunch break at our Lunch Buddy Cafe.
